DRR needs to ensure timely submission of expenditure statements and utilization certificates by its associate network centres in a manner suitable for auditing its expenditure by NAIP audit. 4. Review of technical progress:

- a. CCPIs CICR, Nagpur; DRR, Hyderabad and SAC, Ahmedabad made presentations on the technical progress. Literature collection, compiling historical database has been done at all the centres. Centres should send the historical database on pests, diseases and weather to be incorporated in the RDBMS being developed at CRIDA at the earliest. Rabi field experiments have been taken up at Maruteru and Coimbatore centres. Other rice and cotton centres to conduct off-season surveys (Ludhiana centre: *Sesamia* incidence in wheat; BPH and stem borer incidence at Cuttack and Mohanpur; pink bollworm and mealybug incidence in Warangal by CRIDA, mealybug at Nagpur and Sirsa; mealybug and mirid at Coimbatore). DRR and CICR will ensure that data is collected by network centres as per standard sampling plans, sample size and data collection and reporting formats. Laboratory experiments may be carried out using existing equipment wherever available until the incubators are procured.
- b. As per CAC recommendation, draft conceptual framework and hypothetical models have been prepared for YSB in rice, mealybug and pink bollworm in cotton. These may be further improved and made ready for presentation in the Next CAC meeting at Bangalore. A similar exercise may be taken up for other target pests in rice and cotton at the earliest. CIC identified concerned persons responsible for this exercise: Mirid bugs in cotton based cropping sytems B. Dharajyothi, CICR-RS, Coimbatore; BPH and WBPH V. Jhansi Lakshmi, DRR, Hyderabad; Leaf folder Ch. Padmavathi, DRR, Hyderabad. These scientists will present and discuss the frameworks in the training cum workshop being organized at CRIDA, Hyderabad in March 1st week, 2009.
- c. CCPI, SAC made a proposal for conducting weekly surveys at 20 well distributed points in each selected district in kharif and rabi seasons (Maruteru for rice and Sirsa for cotton) as part of data requirements for validation of remotely sensed weather data visà-vis pest incidence. As this entails considerable expenditure, a technical and financial proposal with proper justification may be prepared and put up in the next CAC for consideration and approval.

5. Conduct of training cum workshop on 'Statistical tools for data analysis"

CIC took note that the training cum workshop will be organized at CRIDA, Hyderabad instead of organizing at NCIPM, New Delhi due to non-availability of accommodation. The training is scheduled for 2-7 March 2009 at CRIDA, Hyderabad. The CIC took note of the program schedule and made suggestions.

- 6. Next data of CIC: The CIC will meet again in April last week at CRIDA, Hyderabad
- **7. Next date of CAC meeting**: The next CAC meeting will be held at PDBC, Bangalore in May 1st week.
